



## A Note from the Pastor . . .

*When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. (Acts 2:1-4)*

On Pentecost Sunday we celebrate the birth of the church when the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and were given the gift of special speech. They used this gift to bring glory to God as they witnessed to all the people present in that moment.

The exercise program held after the Senior Luncheon provides health benefits of strengthening and cardio conditioning that are able to adjust to each person's ability level; including those with wheelchairs, canes, and walkers. A core group now eagerly waits to participate; perhaps it is the social aspect of singing and laughing.

The blood pressure screening program has also continued in my absence, thanks to Jeanne Hayduk and Jeanie Hetherman stepping in. About 10-15% of the senior group participates. Swine flu preparedness packets and fall prevention awareness tip sheets have been distributed.

## Parish Nurse Corner (*Body, Mind, and Spirit*)

### Seasons

The calendar is built around days, months, and years; then divided into seasons: spring, summer, fall, and winter. The glory of spring brings to mind the first sprouting of the crocus's, followed by daffodils and tulips, and the warmth of the sun returning. Winter, on the other hand, is a cold, still, lifeless time; with days that are gloomy and dark. Life is referred to, at times, as the "seasons of life" - perhaps to provide comparison that is mutually understood. The movie, *Lion King* refers to the "circle of life" which, as with the seasons of nature, can be compared to life and its times filled with a circular series of ups and downs.

My awareness of these seasons and relation to life has grown clearer since December. A quick fall backwards to the ground started my January out with increasing pain, along with returns to the doctor and medical diagnostic tests. I was plunged into a time of life's winter that felt deep, dark, and lonely. While experiencing unrelenting pain, inability to rest (physically or mentally), intolerable to eat, sadness with returning to the doctor and medical tests and treatments—a realization struck me! That the worst part of the doctor visits is verbalizing what is wrong. You reinforce the negative thoughts by writing on the questionnaire's, repeatedly telling the medical personal, and YOU HEAR the words again. Negativity prevails!

My rescuer - MY LORD! I reached for the Bible and, as always when I am down, I turn to the book of PSALMS. David understood these seasons of life and provides a path for healing for each of us to follow when all other earthly sources say there is "no hope". David's words assure us that our HOPE is in and with the LORD. Another book of comfort that came across my path was by Charles R. Swindoll: *Encourage ME: Caring Words for Heavy Hearts*. Chuck described David writing in his journal when "cornered, bruised by adversity, and struggling with a low self-esteem".

"In You, O Lord, I have taken refuge (the KJV says: "I put my trust"); let me never be put to shame; deliver me in Your righteousness. Turn Your ear to me (the KJV - "Bow down Your ear to me"), come quickly to my rescue (the KJV - "Deliver me speedily"); be my rock of refuge, a strong fortress to save me." (Psalm 31: 1-2)




Warm words to say out loud that can provide healing comfort to a winter season's aching heart and soul. Refuge is repeated twice in the version Chuck quoted from *Psalms of My Life* by Joseph Bayly. "Refuge", as a Hebrew term is a protective place, a place of safety, security, and secrecy. "To seek refuge with someone", you would have to place your trust in them. David's refuge was described throughout the Psalms as the One he called, "My Strength, Mighty Rock, Fortress, Stronghold, and High Tower" filled with trust. David's winter season description is an emotional feeling many of us experience:


"Be merciful to me, O Lord, for I am in distress; my eyes grow weak with sorrow, my soul and my body with grief. My life is consumed by anguish (KJV—"And my years with sighing"); my strength fails because of my guilt and my bones grow weak." Psalms 31: 9-10

**SEASONS**—David describes, in Psalm 139: 13-16, how God created each one of us as individuals, AND that HE detailed each and every moment of our lives. "You scheduled each day of my life before I began to breathe. Each day was recorded in Your Book!" Read this verse again. Read it again - out loud. Crisis, life-threatening illness, and chronic illnesses can bring us to our knees. That which David called "the slimy pit... the mud and mires". Cry out as David did, "Hear MY cry (prayer) O LORD!". I have learned during this season of winter that the Lord ALWAYS comes to my side— bringing comfort, love, and warmth to help me see that spring lives just beneath the snowy surface of winter. Bette Midler's song "The Rose" has the lyrics: "just remember in the winter, far beneath the bitter snow, lies a seed that with the sun's Love, in the spring becomes the rose".

When you experience a winter in your circle of life, remember David. Open the book of Psalms and hear the hope, love, and comfort when you place your trust in, and are seeking a place of refuge with, the Lord. You will discover the seed the Lord plants in you will bloom to the beauty He has already planned and written in HIS BOOK before you were born.

## Conference Kits

The UMW will be taking donations for this year's annual Kits for Conference starting in May. The last day to drop off items will be **Sunday, June 12th**. Our pastor and friends will be taking our assembled kits to Roanoke this year as they attend to the business of the United Methodist church at Annual Conference. As you shop this spring, we are asking you to consider picking up a few items to include in the Health Kits that will be sent to a depot, usually the Sager-Brown Depot in Louisiana — to be distributed where they are most needed in the months to come. You have the option of getting individual items or putting together a complete kit yourself and dropping it off at church. On June 12th, the UMW will gather after the worship service and assemble as many kits as we have items and then send any extras to be added to someone else's extras to make more kits.

We have chosen to collect items for Health Kits this year and our goal is to send at least fifteen completed kits. The items needed are listed below. Please drop off **ONLY** the items listed. They have to put only these specific items in the kits. All kits must be exactly the same. No personal notes and no toothpaste. Also note that the toothbrushes must be the single pack ones - not the more economical multipacks. Please avoid the combs that have a pointed handle as well. These are not usually accepted. We are also accepting donations for items and we will fill kits with any items we are missing. The UMW will donate gallon size plastic bags to contain all items.

Thanks again for your warmth and generosity in this outreach ministry.

### Health Kits:

- 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27", no kitchen towels);
- 1 washcloth;
- 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized);
- 1 metal nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers);
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap (3 oz. and up);
- 1 toothbrush (**single brushes** only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes);
- 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages (Band-Aids).
