
## HOMECOMING contributed by Cathy Harris

# Covenant Discipleship at Marshall UMC initiated by Terri Hill

John Wesley, founder of the Methodist denomination, was a great believer in small groups. Through his sermons, we understand this concept was very important for him. Wesley taught that these groups should be small, supportive, trusting, and prayerful.

The purpose for a covenant discipleship group is to hold one another mutually accountable for their discipleship. Members are to encourage and lift each other up through all the ups and downs of daily life.

The groups should focus on 4 main areas of life: Acts of Compassion, Acts of Justice, Acts of Worship, and Acts of Devotion - in keeping with the General Rule of Discipleship (to witness to Jesus Christ in the world and to follow his teachings through acts of compassion, justice, worship, and devotion under the guidance of the Holy Spirit).

After recently taking the online Servant Leadership class and hearing some comments from several people in our church family, I think this is something we need and could greatly benefit from.

There are only a few guidelines to get this going:

- 1. Find 3-7 people to be in the group.
- 2. Find a day and time convenient for everyone.
- 3. Create a covenant, based on the 4 Acts of Compassion, Justice, Worship, and Devotion.
- 4. Share where you saw God in the 4 Acts or where you did not see Him.
- 5. Pray for one another earnestly!

The UMC website (umcdiscipleship.org) states that Covenant Discipleship groups are where Christians "watch over one another in love" by giving each other a weekly compass heading. The mutual accountability and support that happens provides the regular compass headings that help us to make course corrections necessary to keep us on the way of Jesus that leads to our desired destination – or what Wesley called "Christian perfection." We work together to become the people God created us to be.

This Sunday when you come to church, look around at those sitting near you. These might be people you want to invite to be in your group. Or find those with similar work schedules to invite. Let me know if you want to be involved, and we will assemble groups for everyone who is interested. I think God has put this on my heart as the next step for our church this year; from weekly prayer meetings to monthly prayer partners to Covenant Discipleship groups. I hope we can continue to have all these interactions as we move forward together.

Check the UMCDISCIPLESHIP.ORG web site, talk to Pastor John or me, or just get a group together and talk it over. The main guideline is to keep the 60-90 minute meetings focused on the Acts of Compassion, Justice, Worship, and Devotion – share and encourage one another on what God is doing in your life, and encourage those in your group to do the same. I hope this will help us all grow our faith and our leadership abilities at Marshall UMC. I am always available to help work through getting started or in any other way I can assist. I can see only benefits from this experience if we stay focused on God and give Him the Glory.
